Nairobi is an international hub for businesses and an entry into the East and Central African countries. It is therefore, accessible from most of the world cities through the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA), Nairobi, and is the only capital city in the world that boasts of a national park – the Nairobi National Park – within its environs where you can enjoy dawn or dusk game drives. While in Nairobi, you can also visit the renowned Karen Blixen Museum, and the enchanting Giraffe Centre, or tour the Daphne Sheldrick Elephant Orphanage.
